Infractions are traffic offenses for which tickets are written and involve fixed fines. A court appearance is not necessary.

Criminal cases involve an individual accused of conduct that has potentially damaged society. There are two main types of criminal cases: misdemeanors and felonies.

Misdemeanors are charges punishable by a fine or imprisonment in the county jail. Misdemeanors include traffic-related offenses such as DUI and no license along with other offenses such as minor consumption and petit theft.

Felonies are charges potentially punishable by incarceration in the state penitentiary. Felonies include crimes such as burglary, 3rd offense DUI and aggravated assault.

Juvenile cases involve youth younger than 18 who violate federal, state, local or municipal laws (except for certain traffic, alcohol, tobacco and watercraft violations which are not processed under the Juvenile Corrections Act).

Civil lawsuits involve non-criminal disputes between two or more parties.
